
have filled a cart exclusively with mysteries. Another features fantasy and science fiction. A wide variety of collectible books are also available. Visit the Friends' web page at

Open all day, every day, the compact wooden book-sharing box offers a selection of books for all ages. Part of a network of more than 200,000 book-exchange libraries throughout the country, the mission of Little Free Libraries is to inspire readers and expand book access. Friends of the East Providence Public Library will provide books to stock the Little Library. The Little Free Library motto is "Take a Book. Share a Book." Users can take home a book to read and are encouraged to bring back a book to share with others.

LIGHTHOUSES AND LIBRARIES

The Friends of the Library are currently working on a new project - to gather old books. In collaboration with the Friends of Pomham Rocks Lighthouse, we are collecting books that were popular from the mid-1800s to the early 1900s. The books will be featured in a Traveling Library Box that the volunteer lighthouse group recently purchased for display in their museum at Pomham Rocks Lighthouse. On the outside, the wooden library box resembles a suitcase with a carrying handle. On the inside, there are shelves for books. In an island lighthouse off the coast of Riverside, lighthouse



keepers and their families at Pomham did not have easy access to books to fill the long hours at an isolated light station. Four times a year, when delivering supplies, lighthouse inspectors would bring a traveling library filled with books and then take the completed library to another lighthouse. Pomham Rocks Lighthouse was built in 1871, so the books they read were quite old. In the weeks before a sale, volunteers prepare thousands of books for display at the sale. We are proud of our reputation for being one of the most organized book sales in the region. We hold our 4-day Spring Book Sale, restock continuously the week-long Books by the Bag Sale and meet with community groups to donate hundreds of requested books. Following the Fall 2024 book sale, we donated more than 800 books to local groups. We then empty

all bookshelves and book carts, filling 75 to 100 boxes of remaining books to be redistributed or recycled. Until all Spring Book Sale books are removed from the building, there is no space to store additional books. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.
